Asemblywoman Michaelle Solages Presents \$10,000 Check for Museum

On August 9, 2022, NYS Assemblywoman Michaelle C. Solages came to our museum for a tour of the displays. She had visited several years ago but that was before all the showcases were in place with completed displays. So she enjoyed seeing all the great

Franklin Square historical artifacts, especially the melted coins from the player piano in the Kalb Hotel fire back in 1923. She was also interested in learning more about the Museum's effort to help raise awareness of heritage plants in cooperation with Boy Scout Matthew Meaney, who constructed the new raised beds in the rear of the museum as part of his Eagle Scout project.



At the conclusion of the tour, Assemblywoman Michaelle C. Solages presented us with a check from New York State for \$10,000 to help pay our ongoing expenses at the museum. A staunch supporter of the museum, she also spent some time with the Historical Society officers discussing how we do our fund raising and offering advice on soliciting donations. A LOOK BACK AT THE HISTORY OF FRANKLIN SQUARE

Under the leadership of Arthur T. Roth (1905 – 1997) the Franklin Square National Bank was renamed the Franklin National Bank. Benjamin Franklin was subsequently adopted as the Bank's symbol. As an instantly recognizable American and icon of thrift and industry, the choice was an appropriate one. Images of Franklin appeared on printed materials, signs, artwork and even a well-known statue at Roosevelt Field.

This white bisque bust of Benjamin Franklin once graced a niche inside the Bank's headquarters. It stands nearly two feet high and is virtually a lifesize image of the famous patriot.

When the Franklin National Bank collapsed in 1974, most images and memorabilia relating to Benjamin Franklin were removed from the Bank's branches to make way for the European-American Bank, or EAB. This bust of



Franklin was acquired by a bank employee who had little practical use for it. She eventually placed it in the basement of her house in Woodmere, Long Island. Fifteen years later in 1989, Franklin Square Village Historian and Hempstead Town Landmarks Commissioner Paul van Wie was inspecting the Woodmere home for possible landmark status. While walking through the darkened basement of the old home, he came face to face with the bust. Startled, he asked the owner of its significance and expressed interest in it on behalf of the Franklin Square Historical Society. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Duffy immediately and very generously donated the bust to the Society, and so that day it was returned to Franklin Square. It was ceremoniously unveiled at a Historical Society meeting in 1989 to the great delight of the membership, and it began a new life as a focal point of the new Franklin Square Museum.
