This will enable the Society to hire an architect and begin to fundraise and seek more grants for the remainder of monies to build a classroom meeting space and storage area on the back of the museum. On April 4, the Franklin Square Museum hosted a Zoom Session on Flag Storage presented by LILRC (the Long Island Li-



brary Resource Council). Nicole Menchise, an expert with more than 13 years' experience in archival techniques, demonstrated the propertechniques to use when storing flags in an archival storage box. Franklin Square Historical Society President Nancy Youngfert assisted Nicole in her demonstration using some of the large old flags in the Museum's collection.
