Move Franklin Square Forward



On June 4, 2024, representatives of the Franklin Square Historical Society and Museum and the Franklin Square Civic Association attended the Town of Hempstead Board Meeting. We spoke about the need to protect the Landmarked Franklin Square Theatre from further destruction through neglect by the building owner. There is a need to strengthen the current landmark laws that other towns on Long Island have that better protect our rich historical landmarks. We also mentioned how one of the empty

stores for rent in our town has no floor in it! There is a need for our elected officials to help us access funding to revitalize our downtown area before there is more decline.

We invited Town officials and local group leaders to come to a meeting at the Franklin Square Museum on June 11th at 7:00 PM to discuss how to Move Franklin Square Forward! We will continue to work with the Town, County and State to access funding to revitalize our community. The Franklin Square Historical Society intends to keep the community informed on any progress we make toward this goal.

May 2024 Membership Meeting

We held our membership meeting at the Franklin Square Public Library in the 1st floor Meeting Room and showed some historic films from Franklin Square's past that were recently digitized with the help of the Long Island Library Resource Council. Our members watched the color silent film of the Rath Park dedication and parade while Paul Van Wie provided commentary on the film. We also showed a black and white film from the 1937 NYC World's Fair held at Flushing Meadows Park. After the films we updated the members



on the latest news on the landmarked Franklin Square theatre and Krauss Funeral Home landmarking request. Two petitions were available for folks to sign to show the Town of Hempstead that we want action on these two items soon.
