Franklin Square Forward—Update

Franklin Square Forward is a coalition of Franklin Square residents dedicated to the renewal and improvement of our village. The working group was formed in response to the need to upgrade and improve Franklin Square's historic downtown area along Hempstead Turnpike. Franklin Square Forward's current emphasis, therefore, is to create and implement a plan to create a thriving, attractive downtown, and one which preserves the historic suburban character of our village.

At an October 17th meeting at the Plattduetsche Park Restaurant attended by over 250 community members the following resolutions were passed:

- That the working group, called "Franklin Square Forward" be authorized to present the basic ideas presented this evening to public officials in an effort to obtain grants and appropriate measures to improve our downtown;
- That Franklin Square Forward create a website to inform every Franklin Square household
 of the progress of this effort and what has been presented this evening;
- That Franklin Square Forward investigate appropriate methods to promote the revitalization of the downtown in partnership with other organizations, public officials, local governments, and property owners so that all of these stakeholders might benefit from the efforts.
- That Franklin Square Forward schedule a follow-up informational meeting in the future.

The members of **Franklin Square Forward** represent a diverse, non-partisan crosssection of local organizations. We are united by our commitment to our hometown, and we encourage all local residents who share our goals to participate in envisioning a renewed downtown we can all be proud of. Frank was trustee of the Historical Society and assisted in the building process for the Franklin Square Museum. Tina was his loyal sidekick and a force in her own right. There were few who were as effective as Tina at persuading local businesses to donate raffle prizes for our events.

Tina worked for Astoria Federal Bank for over 20 years. She was also a member of St. Catherine of Sienna church and participated in many community activities. She and Frank were married sixty-six years and Tina was a mother of four children, grandmother of six and great grandmother of another six. She will be truly missed by the members of the Franklin Square Historical Society.
